Update on Water Authority Relocation of Water Lines Ahead Of Construction of Rio Grande Candelaria Roundabout As of March 29, 2019

SPECIAL NOTE: Rio Grande and Candelaria intersection will be open as of 3 a.m. Saturday Morning, March 30, 2019.

For the weekend only, the following traffic restrictions will be in place:

- 1) One lane of traffic will be open on Rio Grande in each direction (north and south).
- 2) One lane of traffic will be open in each direction on Candelaria (east and west).

At the intersection of Rio Grande & Candelaria:

Northbound traffic on Rio Grande:

Traffic will be allowed to turn east or west on Candelaria, or continue northbound from a stop sign.

Southbound traffic on Rio Grande:

Traffic will be allowed to turn east or west on Candelaria, or continue southbound from a stop sign.

Westbound traffic on Candelaria:

Traffic will be allowed to continue westbound or turn right, heading north on Rio Grande from a stop sign. The lefthand turn bay will be closed, but traffic can turn left and continue south on Rio Grande from a stop sign.

Eastbound traffic on Candelaria:

Traffic will be allowed to continue eastbound, or turn right and head south on Rio Grande from a stop sign. The lefthand turn back will be closed, but traffic can turn left and continue north on Rio Grande from a stop sign.

Pedestrians will be able to cross the intersection in all directions using the existing crosswalks, but should use extra caution.

Traffic signals will be installed as of Monday morning, April 1 at 8 a.m. and the turn bays will be opened.

We will send a new notification with a map on Sunday, March 31.

Motorists are encouraged to slow down at the intersection, watch for other traffic, take turns, and watch for pedestrians.
